Begin on the Lower Level in the special exhibition The Medici's Painter: Carlo Dolci and 17th-Century Florence. Carlo Dolci was born in the year 1616 in Florence, Italy. When he was just nine years old, he entered the Florentine workshop of the painter Jacopo Vignali. Just take a look at the stunning detail of Dolci's work!

- 1. Find the self-portrait of Carlo Dolci.
- 2. What do you notice about this self-portrait?

3. Draw your own self-portrait here. What do you want viewers of your self-portrait to know about you?



6. Next, find the Portrait of the Archduchess Claudia Felicitas as Galla Placidia. Can you find the following objects hidden in this painting? (Hint: this painting will be somewhere to the left of Dolci's self-portrait.)

10. Now find the artist's sketchbook.

11. Do you see the two hands? Who do you think drew the hand on the left? Who might have drawn the hand on the right?




Now that you have seen some of Carlo Dolci's artwork, you have the opportunity to make your very own sketchbook!

Complete the Dolci Sketchbook activity, and have a Davis staff member stamp your booklet here once you have completed your sketchbook.




