## Important Steps Required for On-Campus Flu Shots

**Step 1:** Advanced registration is required. In order to receive a vaccine, please book your appointment by **this Friday, October 11**.

Click [HERE](#): [SIGN UP FOR YOUR FLU SHOT](#) and you will find a button stating **select service**. Select **Seasonal Flu Clinic**, and the date of your clinic will be in white within a calendar. Click on the available date, select a time and follow the prompts. When you complete the appointment process, a reminder email regarding the clinic appointment will be sent.

Appointments are scheduled 10 minutes apart to maintain appropriate spacing within the site of the clinic.

**Step 2:** All participants must complete, sign and **bring the [consent form](#)** to the clinic.
